

Mrs. John H. Kolbo

Funeral services for Mrs. John H. Kolbo, were held Thursday at 2:00 p. m., at the First English Lutheran Church, with the Rev. Carl T. Thompson officiating. A quartet, namely, Mr. and Mrs. S. E. Windh, Mrs. John Gibbs and Maurice Olson, sang. Burial was in the Groton cemetery. Pallbearers were LeRoy Thompson, Clark; Erlin Rasmusson, Watertown; Vernon Rasmusson, Crocker; Richard Grove, Edina, Minn.; Jack Kolbo, Aberdeen and Melvin Steinlicht, LaBolt.

Mrs. Anna Mary Olson Kolbo was born June 27, 1885, at La Crosse, Wis. She passed away on Monday, May 5, 1958, at her home here, at the age of 72 years, 10 months and 8 days.

Mrs. Kolbo was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith and remained a steadfast member until death, being a member of the First English Lutheran Church, Groton, and the Women's Missionary Federation of that church.

On May 27, 1908, she was united in marriage with John H. Kolbo at the Lily Lutheran church. Mr. and Mrs. Kolbo would have observed their 50th wedding anniversary this year. To this union five children were born. They are: (Ovelia) Mrs. Kenneth Likness, Summit, S. D.; Orville, Claremont; (Frances) Mrs. Rodney Cameron, Cedar Rapids, Iowa; Hiran and Juel of Groton. There are 13 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

After their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Kolbo homesteaded near Hettinger, N. D., for one year. They then resided in the Crocker vicinity for several years. In 1923 they moved to Langford and lived there until 1940, when they moved to Aberdeen for three years before coming to Groton.

Left to mourn, besides her husband and immediate family, are two brothers, Clarence and Oscar Rasmusson, Crocker, and two sisters, Mrs. Peter Flatten, St. Louis Park, Minn., and Mrs. Edmund Larson, Cashton, Wis.

Her parents, one sister and one brother preceded her in death.
