# FREDERICK KRANHOLD

February 8, 1915, at his home in Groton, occurring after an illness of more than a year. It was just about two weeks ago that Mr. Kranhold suffered a paralytic stroke. Since that time he has been unable to get up well, being forced to remain in bed most of the time. He had a second stroke and did not recover getting worse until the end came.

Gottlieb Kranhold was born in Groton, Saxon, Germany, in 1853. In 1853 he came to America with his parents and they settled in Adams county, Wis. Here he married Anna Kraus and moved to White Bear, Minn., in 1883 when he came to Groton settling on a farm six and a half miles northwest of here. He remained until a few years ago when they removed to Groton.

Mr. Kranhold was the father of a family of six girls and one boy who were born in his home. Of these he leaves behind him except the boy who died some years ago. He also leaves behind him to mourn his death his brothers, Frederick Kranhold of Groton, and J. A. Kranhold of St. Paul, and J. A. Kranhold of Appleton, Wis. The girls are Pasch, Doran, Minn.; Ella Pfeiffer, Emma Anderson and Nora Kranhold.

A funeral will be held Thursday afternoon at the house at 1 and 1/2 miles from Groton at 1:30 p.m. by J. Scott Butt conducting.
