Henry W. Krege

Henry W. Krege, 64, 839 South High Street, Aberdeen, died unexpectedly Saturday, August 4.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, Aug. 8, at 10 a.m. at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Aberdeen with the Rev. Raymond L. Pomplun officiating. Burial was at Sunset Memorial Gardens, Aberdeen.

Henry William Krege was born in rural Brown County near Columbia on November 7, 1908, to Gustav and Amelia Podoll Krege. He attended a rural school near Columbia and later farmed with his parents. He was married to Edna Bohling at Columbia June 24, 1936. They farmed north of Columbia until they moved into Columbia where he worked at the Buntrock Hardware Store and later for the Farm Power Co. In 1952, they returned to farming until 1957 when they moved to Aberdeen where Mr. Krege was employed by the Aberdeen School System as a custodian and grounds superintendent of Simmons Field until the time of his death.

He was a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church where he had been a deacon for a number of years.

Survivors include his widow; two sons, Donald of Lemmon and Arlan of Loon Lake, Wash.; two daughters, Mrs. Jerome (Luella) Hochhalter of Columbia and Mrs. Curtis (Janice) Sombke of Groton; four sisters, Mrs. Otto (Elizabeth) Buntrock of Columbia, Mrs. Edwin (Amelia) Komrosky of Valley City, N.D., Mrs. Albert (Ella) Weihrach of Groton and Mrs. Elmer (Esther) Christianson of Columbia; and fifteen grandchildren.
