Services for Paul E. Krueger, 88, retired Groton farmer, were held Tuesday, July 30, at the First Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Robert Carey officiating. Burial was in the Groton Union Cemetery.

Music was provided by the congregation accompanied by Mrs. Ben Anderson, organist.

Honorary pallbearers were Oliver Belden, Leonard Broman Jr., August Grieben, Randall Hall Sr., Vance Miller, Foster Rix and Otho Rix. Active pallbearers were Ben Anderson, Wilford Dresbach, Jerroll Erdmann, Arthur Lange, Dennis Larson and Henry Lehman.

Paul Krueger was born in Groton, October 31, 1886. He graduated from Groton High School and the University of South Dakota. Although prepared to teach and coach, he came home at the death of his father in 1915 to take over the farm operation and remained at the job until moving to Groton in 1949.

He was united in marriage to Laura Millman, October 13, 1917, and to this union one daughter, Margaret, was born.

Mr. Krueger was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in which he served as a trustee, deacon, ruling elder, and was a member of the choir for 20 years.

He was a member of the Groton Masonic Lodge and the Yelduz Shrine in Aberdeen. He served on the Board of Directors of the Ferney Farmers Elevator, the High Grade Oil Co., Northern Electric, Crop Improvement Association, the State Grain Dealers Association and was a member of the Groton Kiwanis Club.

Mrs. Krueger died May 1, 1964.

Mr. Krueger entered the Clark Nursing Home in 1969 and died there Saturday, July 27.

Survivors include his daughter, Mrs. Robert (Margaret) Brigham, Union, Wash.; one brother, Frederick, Oklahoma City, Okla.; four grandchildren; eight nieces; and six nephews.
