## William Krueger

Funeral services were held Thursday at 2:30 p. m., in the West Hanson Lutheran church for William Krueger, 76, who passed away Sunday, Jan. 1, at the home of his daughter in Aberdeen. The Rev. R. M. Grundler officiated. Burial was in the West Hanson cemetery.
