MRS. LEO LE CLAIR DIED WEDNESDAY

PASSES AT ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL
AFTER ILLNESS OF BUT
A FEW DAYS

Mrs. Leo LeClair, of Putney, nee Blanche W. Smith, passed away on Wednesday morning at the St. Luke's hospital at Aberdeen from poisoning, self administered, presumably by mistake.

Deceased was born at Guilford, Ill., on April 20, 1894. During the early years of her childhood, the family moved west, settling around Putney, remained there for some time and then changed their residence to Groton.

She was united in marriage to Leo LeClair, a short time ago and they took possession of the Clark farm near Putney where she resided up to the time of her death.

She is survived by her husband, and other relatives, including her mother, Mrs. Beckenkeller, Alfred Smith, of Milner, N. D., and Leo J. Smith, of Putney, and a sister Mrs. W. W. Mason, of San Jose, California.

Funeral services were held at the Evangelical church at Groton on Saturday, Rev. Harrold officiating, and interment was made in Groton Union cemetery.
