Mrs. Gust Lenling Dies From Paralytic Stroke

Mrs. Gust Lenling, 67, who has been making her home in Aberdeen with her daughter for the past few months, died last Saturday after a week's illness following a paralytic stroke.

Mrs. Lenling was born in Berlin, Germany, February 27, 1870, and came to South Dakota in 1885, settling near Ferney. In 1899 she moved to Groton vicinity and April 15, 1900, was married to Mr. Lenling, the ceremony taking place at James. She was the mother of eight children, two of whom have passed away. Those surviving her are: Helen Smith of Sparta, Wis.; Louisa Sombke, of Verdon; Mrs. Henry Kenitzer of Aberdeen; Mrs. Mary Bohn of Aberdeen; Mrs. Anna Heying (Hein) of Aberdeen; Mrs. Emma Biegler of Aberdeen.

Two sisters and three brothers also survive her. They are Minnie Rose of Moorehead, Minn., and Mrs. Bertha Rosenow, of Beloit, Wis. The brothers are Otto Rose of Detroit, Mich.; Robert Rose of Reeder, N. D., and Paul Rose of Groton. Twenty-one grand-children and five great grand-children are also mourners.

The funeral will be held Thursday at 2 p. m., from St. John's Lutheran church with Rev. F. E. Wilke conducting it. Burial will be made in Groton cemetery.
