## Mrs. Cora Miller Dies Unexpectedly Sunday

The Groton community was shocked Monday afternoon by the sudden and unexpected death of Mrs. Cora Miller. She apparently died Sunday afternoon of a heart attack in her home where she has lived for many years. Late Monday afternoon she was discovered by her neighbors who had not seen her about in her usual manner. She was found in her living room surrounded by her treasured books and flowers.

Mrs. Cora Miller was the widow of the late Orion H. Miller, local merchant, co-founder and proprietor of the Miller Merc. Co., who preceded her in death March 17, 1926. Mrs. Miller had been a resident of the Groton community for about 45 years, having come here with her brother, Herbert Ingelse at that time. They resided on different farms in the community. She taught school in the local schools until her marriage to O. H. Miller in 1912.

Mrs. Miller is survived by two sisters living in Sheboygan, Wis.; one daughter, Mrs. B. L. Gage, and one son, Norman C. Miller, both of Minneapolis, Minn.; one step-son, Vance E. Miller of Groton and six grandchildren.

Mrs. Cora Miller was active in the local Methodist church, the Women's Foreign Missionary Society, the W. C. T. U., and many other organizations. She was a charter member of the P. E. O. Sisterhood. Mrs. Miller lived a rather quiet life, but took part in the better things in the community. She was kind and considerate of those with whom she came in contact and will be deeply missed by those closest to her.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon from the Methodist church in Groton at 2:30 p. m., with the Rev. Frederick G. MacKenzie officiating. Burial will be in the Groton cemetery in the family lot.
