Mrs. W. T. Millman Dies After a Long Illness

Mrs. W. T. Millman, a highly respected lady of this city, expired last Friday morning after a lingering illness of over a year. Mrs. Millman has not been in the best of health for some time. In fact, she has shown a gradual decline since the death of Mr. Millman some time ago. Mrs. Millman was making her home with her daughter, Mrs. P. E. Krueger at the time of her death.

The deceased was born at Elk Grove, Wis., January 9, 1845, and was 75 years of age at the time of her death. On March 27, 1879, she was united in marriage to W. T. Millman, the ceremony taking place at Elk Grove, and to this union two children were born, both of whom survive. They are Ben Millman and Mrs. Krueger. One sister, Miss Eva Richards, of Milwaukee, also survives.

Mrs. Millman, together with her husband and children, came to South Dakota in 1904 and settled at Clark. They lived at this place for a number of years, and moved to Groton in 1919, where Mr. and Mrs. Millman made their home until the time of their deaths.

The funeral was held at the home on Sunday conducted by the Rev. Benson, of the Methodist church, of which body Mrs. Millman was a life-long member, with Rev. Spence of the Presbyterian church assisting. The remains were laid to rest in Groton cemetery.
