Early Pioneer Dies After Long Illness

Michael Mulligan, of this city, one of the early pioneers of Brown county, died at his home here Tuesday night after an illness extending back for the past three or four years. Mr. Mulligan has been bed-ridden a greater part of this time. His death was probably due to the infirmities of old age since he was almost 90 years old at the time of his death.

Mr. Mulligan was born in Ireland and came to this country when a lad. He settled near Groton forty-three or forty-four years ago, and has made his residence here all during that time.

He is survived by four children—Mrs. Zeck and Mrs. Noltner, of Aberdeen, and Mrs. Jack Peterson and Mrs. Wm. Reid of this city. One child died some years ago.

No arrangements had been made for the funeral at the time of going to press, but since Mr. Mulligan subscribed to the teachings of the Catholic faith, he will be buried under the rites of that church.
