Warren E. Newberry Died Suddenly Thursday

Funeral services were conducted for Warren E. Newberry, Sunday afternoon, Dec. 9, at 3:30 o'clock at the Paetznick Funeral Home with Rev. L. C. Benson officiating. Interment was made at the Groton Union cemetery.

Warren E. Newberry was born at Monan, Ind., March 24, 1884. He came to South Dakota in 1901, and settled in the Groton area where he farmed until 1913, when he went to Montana and settled on a homestead. In 1918 he returned to Groton and continued farming operations until 1944, when he moved to Groton and made his home with his sister, Mrs. Harry Samuel.

His death was attributed to a heart attack according to Brown County Corner Leo Krueger and state officials who investigated the mishap last Thursday morning when his body was found behind the wheel of his truck near Groton. The truck had left the highway and plunged through a fence into a pasture.

He was preceded in death by one sister, two brothers and his parents. Surviving are three sisters: Mrs. Harry Samuel of Groton, Mrs. Susie Coe, Seattle, Wash., and Mrs. Grace Henecke of Oswego, N. Y., and one brother, Boyd Newberry of Billings, Mont. Surviving also are fourteen nieces and nephews.

Mr. Newberry was a quiet spoken man, but made hosts of friends through his honesty and kindly disposition, who will learn of his departure with keen regret.
