## Max Oschmann

Services for Max Oschmann, 74, Groton resident formerly of the Columbia area, were held at 2 p.m. Friday, Feb. 13, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Groton with the Rev. Terry L. Cashmer officiating.

Burial was in Sunset Memorial Gardens, Aberdeen.

Mr. Oschmann died Tuesday, Feb. 10, at St. Luke's Hospital in Aberdeen after a brief illness.

Mrs. Eugene Neuman was organist and accompanied the Rev. John G. Brunner of Columbia when he sang "Be Still My Soul" and "The Lord's Prayer." The congregation sang "Beautiful Savior" and "The Strife is O'er, the Battle Done."

Max Hugo Oschmann was born September 23, 1901, in the Frederick - Columbia area of Brown County. He attended school in Garland Township and later attended St. John's Parochial School in Columbia. He started farming with his parents and later farmed with his brother, Art until 1942.

He married Lena Aswege on June 14, 1933, at Johnson, Minn., and they established their home on the family farm until 1942 when they moved to their own farm. They continued to live on the farm until 1970.
