### FRANK PAETZNICK

Well Known Pioneer of Groton Dies  
at Lavinia, Montana.

Frank Paetznick, an old pioneer of Groton, answered the last call at his home at Lavinia, Montana, on Monday morning, at the age of sixty-three years.

The cause of the death has not been learned by his relatives here, but was followed after a brief illness.

His remains were shipped to Groton, and funeral services will be held at the Methodist church on Friday afternoon, at 2:00 o'clock. Rev. C. B. Harold will officiate.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his wife, Theresa Paetznick, two sons, William J. and Frank Paetznick, two daughters, Mrs. Ed. Koepsel and Mrs. Eugene Funk; also three brothers, H.
