FRANK PALMER

From the Madison Outlook of the 10th, we glean the following regarding the death of Frank Palmer, whose demise was noted in these columns two weeks ago:

Frank Palmer died at the Samaritan hospital, Sioux City, last Thursday morning from an acute attack of diabetes. He had been afflicted with the fatal malady for several years, but it was only during the past few weeks that it assumed an alarming condition, since when everything possible was done to ward off the final summons, but to no avail.

Mr. Palmer had been a resident of Madison for the past twenty years, and built up a large business, being proprietor of the Fair store in this city, with a branch at Junius, and only recently he was planning to establish other branches in other nearby towns. So much for human plans. Deceased was known as a man of sterling integrity and had a host of warm personal friends.

The remains were brought to this city Sunday afternoon and funeral services were held at the home of his mother-in-law, Mrs. S. S. Fliteroff, conducted by Rev. F. E. Stockton. Interment in Graceland cemetery.

Deceased leaves a father and step-mother, Mr. and Mrs. James of Groton, and a daughter by a former marriage, Mrs. C. F. Lockwood of Oklahoma. The latter was unable to be present at the funeral, but her husband, Dr. Lockwood was in attendance.

The stores here and at Junius are closed for invoicing and we understand they will be sold in bulk at an early date. Mr. Palmer carried \$9000 life insurance. His property was considerably involved, but there will be quite an estate to pass on to the daughter.
