## Mrs. Ida Pollish

Services for Mrs. Ely L. (Ida) Pollish 90, former Ferney resident, were held at 2 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 10, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Ferney. She died at her home in Beloit, Wis., Thursday, Dec. 3.

The Rev. Edwin A. Rumerfield officiated and burial was in the Ferney cemetery.

Music was provided by Clarence Baule, soloist, who sang "Asleep in Jesus" and "Heaven is My Home", accompanied by Mrs. Art Raap, organist.
