## Delbert Pray Dies In Seattle, Wash., Hospital

Delbert Pray, a former Groton boy, died Monday morning at a hospital at Seattle, Wash., from the effects of infantile paralysis, an epidemic which seems to be sweeping that section of the country, according to word received here Monday afternoon.

The deceased left Groton about two years ago for Seattle and his since made his home there.

The remains are expected to reach Aberdeen Friday or Saturday and will be laid to rest in Riverside cemetery of that city.

Mr. Pray was 27 years of age and was well and favorably known here. News of his death will cause widespread sorrow among his many friends.
