Last Rites Held Sunday For Mrs. Nora Rehfuss

News reached this vicinity last Thursday of the death of Mrs. Nora Rehfuss, well-known Groton lady, at a hospital in Minneapolis on Thursday, Feb. 6, following a lingering illness.

A. Eleanora Mueller was born May 11, 1876, at Norwalk, Wis. When but a child she moved with her parents to the Groton vicinity, where she resided for a long term of years. On Sept. 20, 1908, she was united in marriage to Emanuel G. Rehfuss and to this union three children were born, Verda Mae, who died in infancy; Charles Eldon of Groton and Mae Lorene, now Mrs. E. R. Wendell of Minneapolis. Mr. Rehfuss passed away on April 16, 1927.

While in Groton, Mrs. Rehfuss was active in the work of the Evangelical church. She moved to Minneapolis in 1939, and there she joined the Wesley Methodist church in 1944.

Funeral services were held for the highly esteemed lady on Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Paetznick Funeral Home with the Rev. L. C. Benson officiating. Mrs. Norma Chilton and Miss Mary Jane Thede, accompanied by Mrs. Joe Williams, sang "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Rock of Ages," which were two of the deceased lady's favorite hymns. Pallbearers were: Charles E. Adams, Fred Frommel, Amos Doeringsfeld, Lyle, Donald and Darrell Clocksene. Interment was made in the family lot in Groton Union cemetery.

Mrs. Nora Rehfuss, as she was commonly known here, was a kind, loving and sympathetic wife and mother, gaining the friendship and love of all who knew her.
