She taught school in Riverside Township. She married Chester W. Craig June 14, 1916, near Claremont. He died in 1944. She married Foster Rix December 8, 1962, at Groton. She was a member of the Presbyterian Church, the United Presbyterian Women, Order of the Eastern Star, the PEO Sisterhood, the Three R Club and the Current Events Club. She had been a resident of the Groton area all of her life.
