Former City Resident Dies at Beloit, Wis.

Friends of Groton and vicinity were deeply saddened when news arrived last week of the passing of Mrs. William H. Rosenow, who died at the Beloit, Riverview Sanitarium, Beloit, Wis., on Thursday, Oct. 2, after an illness of several months. Funeral services were held at the Rosman-Uehling-Kinzer Chapel, Saturday, at 1:30 p. m., with the Rev. Baese officiating. Burial was in Eastlawn cemetery.

Mrs. Rosenow, a former resident of this city, and held in high esteem by a large circle of friends and relatives here, was born June 15, 1885, at Lomira, Wis., and prior to her marriage to William H. Rosenow on October 5, 1902, at Groton, was Miss Bertha Rose. They left this city in 1936 and have resided in Beloit since.

The departed was a kind and loving wife and mother, and was deeply loved by all who knew her. Her high ideals in life gained for her the fellowship of all. She was a member of St. John's Luthern church.

Survivors are her husband; two sons, Herman and Harold, both of Beloit; three granddaughters; a sister, Mrs. Ferd Rose of Plummer, Minn., and two brothers, Otto Rose of Fontana, Calif., and Robert Rose of Reeder, N. Dak.
