

# Faye V. Rossow

Faye V. (Miller) Rossow, 96, of Groton and formerly of Columbia, died Saturday, January 16, 1999 at the Beverly Health Care Center, Groton. The funeral was held January 20, 1999, at the United Church of Christ, Columbia, with the Rev. Sheila Apland officiating. Burial was at Riverside Cemetery, Aberdeen, under the direction of the Miller-Huebl Funeral Home, Aberdeen.

Faye Shore was born July 4, 1902 to Kathryn (Hilt) and John Shore on a farm near Irving, Ill. She was home taught until the fifth grade and then attended rural grade school. She attended high school in Hillsboro, Ill., until her senior year when she moved with her family to a farm north of Columbia. She graduated from Aberdeen Central High School. She attended Northern Normal and Industrial School at Aberdeen and taught in schools in rural Brown County.

She married Edver Arthur Miller on August 14, 1929 at Aberdeen. Edver died November 23, 1953. Faye moved to Waubay, and taught school until her retirement in 1967. She married Harold Rossow on December 28, 1966. They moved to California and lived there until moving back to Groton in 1987. She became a resident of the Beverly Health Care Center in Groton in November of 1995.

At the time of her death she was a member of the United Methodist Church in Groton. She was a past member of the United Church of Christ, Columbia, where she was deaconess, Sunday School superintendent and a member of the Ladies Aide. She was past president of the PTA in Columbia, member of the Extension Club of Waubay and Columbia and a member of the Order of the Eastern Star of Columbia.

She was a beautiful seamstress with her specialty being quilt making. She made her first quilt at the age of nine and her last quilt at the age of ninety.

Faye is survived by her husband, Harold Rossow of Groton; one brother, Paul Shore of Cody, Wyo.; three sons, Maurice (Maxine) Miller of Brookfield, Wis., Kenneth (Carol) Miller of Aberdeen, and Arthur Miller of Boulder, Nev.; three daughters, Wanda (Gene) Edwards of Mesa, Ariz., Patricia (Jim) Bell of Corpus Christi, Texas, and Bonnie (Marvin) Kluck of Aberdeen; two stepsons, Gerry Rossow of California and Curtis Rossow of California; one stepdaughter, Lois (Norman) Prusia of Denver; 17 grandchildren; 10 step grandchildren; 21 great-grandchildren and numerous step great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her first husband, one brother, one sister, one stepdaughter and one son-in-law.

Casketbearers will be her grandchildren.
