Mrs. Josephine Sieh, a pioneer of Brown county, passed away at her home in Aberdeen, Saturday morning, August 2, at eight o'clock, after an illness which has extended over a year.

Born at Tabor, near Prague, Austria in 1849 she came to the United States with her parents when but six years of age. The family resided at Prairie du Chien, Wis., and it was there that she was married to John Sieh in 1869. Her husband died July 10, 1915.

Mrs. Sieh came to this section in 1883 and for a number of years lived on the family homestead west of Groton on the banks of Chedi Lake, enduring the hardships of the early settlers. She lived a life of sacrifice for her children, and remained on earth long enough to see them grow to womanhood and manhood.

She is survived by three sisters and two brother and the following children: Julia Giesen, Minneapolis; Agnes Rasmussen, Putney; Florence Cody, Groton; William J. Sieh, Groton; Lewis T. Sieh, Emerson, Neb.; John H. Sieh, Bath; Frank L. Sieh, Aberdeen; Charles A. Sieh, James; Mabel Haire, Putney; Rose McNamara, New Richmond, Wis.; Leone Sieh, Aberdeen.

The funeral was held Monday, Aug. 4, at 9:30 o'clock from the Sacred Heart church in Aberdeen. Interment was made at the Groton cemetery.
