

## Mrs. Stange

Funeral services for Anna Marie Stange, 78, of Columbia, were held at the First Baptist Church in Aberdeen with the Rev. Harold E. Salem officiating on Wednesday, June 20. Burial was at Sunset Memorial Gardens in Aberdeen, with the Huebl Funeral Chapel in charge of the arrangements. Mrs. Stange passed away at the Americana Healthcare Center in Aberdeen on Sunday, June 17.

Anna Marie Hult was born at Strandburg on February 27, 1901, to Solomon and Selma Trupp Hult. She moved with her family to Prentice, Wis., as a child, and this is where she attended school and grew up. She later attended Northern State College in Aberdeen and received her teaching certificate. She then taught school at Stratford. She was married to Oscar R. Stange at Prentice, Wis., on Sept. 26, 1921. They made their first home on their farm in the Stratford area, where they farmed until 1949, when they moved to the Columbia area and farmed 2 1/2 miles N.E. They retired in 1962 and continued to live on the farm with their son. Mr. Stange died on April 28, 1967, and

She is survived by one son, Robert L. Stange of Columbia, and two sisters, Mrs. Russell "Selma" Erbe of Superior, Wis., and Esther Hult of Cedar Falls, Iowa. She was preceded in death by her parents and husband.

She was a member of the First Baptist Church in Aberdeen, past state president of King's Daughters and Sons, and had received her 50 year pin from the Rondell King's Daughters and Sons, and had taught Sunday School for many years.
