Funeral Held on Friday For Ed. Stauffenberg, 78

Ed. Stauffenberg, for 27 years a resident of this community, passed away at the St. James hospital at Chicago, Heights, Ill., on Monday evening, Nov. 11.

He was born in Green Garden, Ill., in 1868. In 1893 he was united in marriage to Mary Reomer and farmed there until 1909, when they moved to near Putney, where they made their home until Mrs. Stauffenberg passed away in 1936. Mr. Stauffenberg moved to Illinois in 1937, where he resided until his death.

Funeral services were held at the Methodist church, Friday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock, with the Rev. L. C. Benson officiating. The Misses Margaret and Myrtle Blader sang two selections accompanied by Mrs. J. Williams. Pallbearers were Lyle and Norman Thurston, Frank Rosenow, Clarence, Marvin and Junior Bettenhausen.

The departed is survived by four daughters, Mrs. Arthur Thurston of Groton; Mrs. Lloyd Wilbur of Manhattan, Ill.; Mrs. Luella Covill, Highland, Ind., and Pearl Stauffenberg of Chamberlain, S. D. One son, Leon, and a daughter, Vernes, preceded him in death.
