## C. P. Streeter

Carroll Streeter, 76, Swarthmore, Pa., editor of the Farm Journal from 1955 to 1968, died Wednesday, Jan. 8, at Taylor Hospital, Ridley Park, Pa.

A memorial service was held at 3 p.m. Friday, Jan. 10, in the Swarthmore Presbyterian Church. Interment was private.

Carroll Streeter was born November 12, 1898, at Groton. His parents were among the first settlers in this area, each having homesteaded a quarter section of land. He attended school here and graduated from Groton High School in 1917. After overseas service with the Army Signal 190th Battalion 1917-1919, World War I, he enrolled at Iowa State University, receiving a BS degree in agricultural economics and a BA in animal husbandry in 1923.

He married Beulah K. Swihart on September 4, 1926.

Mr. Streeter was associate editor and editor of Farm Journal 1939-1969. He had begun his career in agricultural journalism as the first farm editor with the Cedar Rapids (Iowa) Evening Gazette 1924-1927, continued it as field editor, Farmer's Wife, St. Paul, Minn., 1927-1939. During his 13 years as editor of Farm Journal, Mr. Streeter visited farming areas in six continents, becoming knowledgeable about the world food situation.

In 1968 he joined the Rockefeller Foundation as a consultant reporting on the foundation's agricultural accomplishments in Asia, South America and Africa.

He is survived by his widow; three children, Mrs. Raymond M. Vincunas of West Hartford, Conn., Jim Streeter of Wallingford and Jack Streeter, New York City; and eight grandchildren, four in Connecticut and four in Wallingford.
