CHARLES STROM PASSES TO BEYOND

GROTON FARMER SUCCUMBS AF-
TER CONFINEMENT OF THREE
YEARS' STANDING

Charles Strom, one of this community's best known and substantial farmers, passed away at his farm home south of Groton Tuesday afternoon, following an illness of three years' standing. Mr. Strom was stricken with paralysis in December, 1933, and since that time has been confined to his home.

He was born in Sweden, and came to South Dakota in January, 1910, settling south of town. He came here from Indiana.

The deceased was married twice. Five children came to bless the first union, all of whom are living. Nine were born to the second marriage, eight of whom survive, together with his faithful wife.

The children are Elmer and Emanuel, Groton; Paul of Milaca, Minn.; Howard of Wilmar, Minn.; Raymond of New York; Mrs. Alice Weith of Chicago; Carl, Clarence, Lorraine, Lloyd, Glen, Donald and Doris of Groton, besides several brothers and sisters in the old country.

The funeral will be held from the Methodist church on Friday afternoon of this week. It will be conducted by Rev. Luther Benson and the remains will be laid to rest in Groton cemetery.
