**Mrs. James Troy Dies
After A Long Illness**

Mrs. James Troy, a highly respected lady of this city, died Wednesday morning at six o'clock, after an illness extending through the past several years, the last two of which she has been confined in bed.

The funeral will be held from the Lutheran church, Friday afternoon at 1:30, with Rev. F. E. Wilke, pastor officiating.

Mrs. Troy was born April 8, 1861, at Salem, Wis., and came to Dakota in 1881, homesteading on land near Groton. She moved to Groton in 1920 and she and family have made their home in this city since that time.

The cause of her death was paralysis of the spine, and she had been continuously confined to her room for the past sixteen months, suffering with this affliction.

Mrs. Troy leaves two daughters to mourn her loss, together with her husband and other relatives. One son is dead. The daughters are Mrs. H. Whisman, of Huron, and Mrs. Elliot Mallett of this vicinity.
