POSTMASTER DIES MON-

Mrs. William Roy Veitch answered the final summons on Monday morning of this week. She had been ill for the past several months, and while the end was not entirely unexpected, announcement of it in Groton came as a shock to her many friends here, who, through years which she had faithfully spent, had learned to respect and honor her highly.

Mrs. Veitch was born in Aylmer, Ontario, February 29, 1880. She came to Dakota with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. Wismer, at the age of five years. She received her education in the Groton schools and for some years taught in the vicinity of Groton.

She was married July 2, 1901, to W. Roy Veitch. Mrs. Veitch was very much interested in Red Cross work. She was a member of the Episcopal church and secretary of the Trinity Episcopal guild. When Mr. Veitch was appointed postmaster Mrs. Veitch took charge of the Groton Herald and conducted it successfully for about two years or until her health gave way. She has been an invalid since that time three years ago.
