Influenza Victim of Groton Dies in
Minneapolis.

Influenza had claimed another victim when our friend Edward Violet passed away last Friday, Oct. 18th, at the Minneapolis City Hospital, after an illness of only three days. The sad news of this good young man's death was not only a shock to the parents, brothers and sisters, but also to all who knew him.

Edward was born on March 30th, 1898, in Ferney, S. D. He lived here in our midst until lately, two weeks ago when he went to the Cities to take up some special work.

He arrived at the age of 20 years, 6 months, 18 days. The mourners are besides the parents, one brother, William Violet, in the army at Camp Dodge Iowa, two sister, Mrs. Marie Sundemeyer, at James, and Mrs. Rosie Holcomb, one half brother, Joseph Jost, four half sisters, Hazel, Louisa, Lillie, and Mable Jost.

The remains were sent from Minneapolis, arriving Sunday morning. Funeral services were conducted by the Lutheran pastor Monday afternoon. Internment took place on the Groton Union Cemetery. We extend condolences to the bereaved relatives who mourn his loss.
