Conrad U. Von Wald, 82, a retired pioneer farmer of rural Stratford, passed away Friday, Sept. 24 at St. Luke's Hospital.

Funeral services were held Monday at 2 p. m. at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Stratford, with Rev. Harry Kriefall officiating. Burial was in the Groton cemetery.
