Emma Wage, 92, Ferney, died at the Colonial Manor, Groton, September 22, 1991. The funeral was held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church Wednesday, Sept. 25, 1991, with the Rev. Dwaine Doremus officiating. Burial was in the Groton Union Cemetery.

Emma Amelia Jorgensen was born May 30, 1899, at Egeland Township, Day County, rural Waubay to Wilhelm and Mary (Carstesen) Jorgensen. She grew up in the Waubay area.
