MRS. AUGUST WAGONER

In the death of Mrs. August Wagoner, which occurred yesterday morning, another of the true and tried pioneer women was numbered with the silent majority.

She had been ailing for some time, and a stubborn fight was made to ward off the Grim Reaper. The best medical aid of Groton and Aberdeen was called, but her seventy years and a breaking constitution outweighed in the end all that skilled physicians and most careful nursing could do.

Mrs. Wagoner was a native of Germany and long a resident of Dodge Co. Wis., before coming to Groton with her family more than twenty-seven years ago. She is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Marquardt, three sons—Frank and Richard of Henry and Reinold of Verdon, and by her aged husband.

The bereaved family has the sympathy of all the old pioneer neighbors and friends.

Funeral services will be held at 12:00 on Saturday, at her late home, by Rev. C. F. Strutz.
