The Life of Lola Wattier



- Lola K. Wattier, 92, of Clark formerly Conde, SD died Friday, June 29, 2012 at Golden Living Center, Clark.
- Mass of Christian Burial will be 10 a.m. Tuesday, July 3 at St. Anthony's Catholic Church, Bristol. Burial will be in the Bristol Cemetery.
- Lola Katherine Jensen was born to Victor and Stella (Steele) Jensen on May 18, 1920 at the family farm. She completed eight grades in school.
- Lola was united in Holy Matrimony to Frederick Clovis Wattier on September 23, 1939 at St. Anthony's parsonage in Bristol, SD. They farmed near Crandall, SD. Fred
