

DEATH OF CHRISTIAN WEIHRACH.

About noon on Friday last the community was startled by the announcement of the death of Christian Wehrauch. Very few knew that he had been ailing; others had learned that he was convalescing from pneumonia, the fever having broken the day previous. But his sickness took a serious turn Friday morning, and death occurred at 10:30.

Seldom has death produced so profound an impression in this vicinity. Mr. Wehrauch was one of the early settlers here, and had established for himself and family a splendid home two miles northwest. He belongs to that class of farmers who have ever sustained the good name of our state. While others failed and were despondent, he moved forward with a steady purpose which won respect, and had always been accounted successful. Such men are a loss to any community, and especially to this country where so much depends upon seeing the bright side of the future.

Deceased was about forty years of age and leaves a wife and three children.

Funeral services occurred at the Lutheran church on Tuesday afternoon, and were attended by a large concourse of people who sincerely mourn the departure of a good and honored citizen.
