## Marvin Yeske

Services for Marvin Yeske, 46, of rural Columbia, were held Friday, Jan. 11, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Columbia with the Rev. Craig Grams officiating.

The organist at the service was Vineta Milbrandt and the soloist was Gordon Wiedman. Ushers were Dwight and Dwain Buntrock.

Mr. Yeske died of an apparent heart attack Wednesday, Jan. 8, at the Brown County Highway Department Building in Aberdeen.

Marvin DuWayne Yeske was born August 12, 1933, at Columbia to Otto and Marguerite Fouts Yeske. He attended school there and later farmed with his parents. He married Bonnie Miller Oct. 30, 1953, at Columbia and they made their home on the family farm. Mr. Yeske worked for South Dakota Wheat Growers and Kimball Electric, both in Columbia. At the time of his death he was working for the highway department.
