### H. S. YOUNG, DECEASED

#### The Pioneer Dentist Passed Away Tuesday Evening

Dr. H. S. Young, dentist, passed away at his home in Groton at eight o'clock Tuesday evening, October 10th, in his sixty-fourth year. Funeral services will be held at the home this afternoon at one o'clock.

Deceased had been in failing health for some months. Early in September, accompanied by Mrs. Young, he went to the G. A. R. gathering at Denver. During the trip he suffered a stroke of paralysis, and upon reaching Groton had to be carried to his home on a cot, and from that time he steadily failed, with little hope on the part of family and friends for his recovery.

Horace S. Young was born at Danielsville, Conn., in 1841. Began the practice of dentistry when a young man, even before dental schools were available, and later took a course in a dental college at Philadelphia. His experience spanned the growth of modern dentistry. In the development of the science he contributed his share toward the experimental work which has brought the dental profession to its present high state of skill and knowledge. For years he practiced at New Haven and other points in Connecticut and Pennsylvania. Coming to South Dakota in 1883 he established business in Groton and practiced the profession which had been his life study until stricken by fatal illness two months ago.

He was a model citizen, conscientious, upright, devoted to his wife and two boys who survive him. Always courteous and kindly in his demeanor, hundreds who come in contact with him during the fleeting years will remember him kindly, and with a feeling of sadness at his departure and sympathy for the stricken family.
