## Bernhardt Zoellner

Sauk City, Wis.—Bernhardt Zoellner, former town of Roxbury resident, passed away at the North Dakota State hospital in Jamestown, last Thursday. He had suffered a severe attack of the flu in 1919 and the after effects necessitated his stay at the hospital ever since.

He was the son of Fred and Fredericka Otto Zoellner, and was born in the town of Roxbury on Feb. 20, 1884. He reached the age of 69 years, five months and three days.

Mr. Zoellner, who was never married, left for North Dakota about 50 years ago and took up homesteading there until his illness forced his retirement.

He is survived by three brothers, Lewis of the town of Roxbury, Otto and Fred of Groton, S. D.; two sisters, Sophia, Mrs. Frank Falkenstein of Lodi, and Emma, Mrs. Fred Jacobi, of Milwaukee.

Others who preceded him besides his parents were two brothers, Carl and William, two sisters, Regina, Mrs. Ed. Kahn, and Clara, Mrs. Gustave Phillip.

Funeral services were held at 2:00 o'clock Monday afternoon from the Zimmerman and Jenewein funeral home, the Rev. Wilson M. Bixler officiating. Burial took place on the family plot in Sauk City cemetery.—Sauk County News.

The departed spent considerable time in the Groton vicinity, visiting with relatives and assisting with farm work on his brothers farms.
