

Mrs. Charles Adams

Mrs. Charles E. Adams passed away at her home in San Clemente, Calif., on January 12, 1962, at the age of 78. She had been in failing health for some time but was seriously injured by a fall in her home just before Christmas and never fully recovered from the effects of the slight concussion she received.

Sue Doran Adams was born in St. Paul, Minn., on August 2, 1883 the daughter of Franklin B. Doran a Civil War veteran and at one time mayor of St. Paul. She attended Macalester College and Northwestern University and then came to Groton as a teacher of music and art in the public schools. In 1920 she was married to Charles E. Adams, who was manager of the local telephone company for many years.

While living in Groton Mrs. Adams was an active member of the PEO Sisterhood, Phosde Club, the Eastern Star, and was organist, choir director and Sunday school teacher in the Presbyterian church. In 1949 the family moved to San Clemente, Calif., where Mrs. Adams continued to be active in the Presbyterian church and PEO.

Mrs. Adams is survived by her husband, Charles, and her two daughters, Miss Margaret E. Adams, a teacher in Santa Ana, Calif., and Mrs. John E. Damon (Jane) of Grand Rapids, Mich., and four grandchildren.

Funeral services were held in the Community Presbyterian church of San Clemente on January 15, 1962, with interment in Melrose Abbey, Santa Ana, California.
