## MRS. BOYNTON GONE

Sarah, wife of William Boynton, died at her home in Groton at 5:30 p. m., Wednesday, July 12th.

Mrs. Boynton had been ailing for some time with kidney trouble, but did not take to her bed until the closing days of June.

When finally bed-ridden she grew rapidly worse, and the ailment was beyond the power of medical skill and the most careful nursing. Although her condition was such that death was inevitable, her courage never failed.

Sarah Van Evary was born in Canada sixty-one years ago. She became the wife of William Boynton in 1864, and two years later moved to Howard City, Mich., where the family resided until 1883, when they moved to Dakota Territory. Four children were born, the oldest, Claud, having died several years ago. She is survived by her husband, two daughters—Mrs. J. E. Townsend of Groton and Mrs. O. E. Camburn of Putney, and one son, Charles.

Funeral services will be held at her late home tomorrow afternoon at two o'clock, and the body will be laid to rest in Union Cemetery.

Her's was a kindly nature. A true wife and devoted mother has gone to her reward; the sincere sympathy of true friends can but slightly lessen the great sorrow of the bereaved.
