Services for Leonard A. Broman Sr., 89, Groton, were held at 2 p.m. Tuesday, April 29, in the Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Groton, with the Rev. Jon Simundson officiating. Mr. Broman died Saturday, April 26, at St. Luke's Hospital.

Burial was in the Groton Union Cemetery.

Mrs. James Stoeckmann sang "He Shall Feed His Flock" and "Hail to the Lord's Anointed," and the congregation sang, "Thine is the Glory," accompanied by Mrs. Kenneth Alberts, organist.

Mr. Broman, a retired farmer, was born October 24, 1885, in Sweden. He came to the United States in 1900, living in Conde until 1908 and then moving to Groton. In 1909 he married Alma Pearson in Conde. She died in 1911. He married Lillian Wennerstrom in Aberdeen in 1916.

Since 1911, Mr. Broman spent most of his life in Groton. From 1913 to 1916 he worked in Minneapolis as a streetcar motorman. For the past five years, he has resided at Bethesda Home in Aberdeen.

Survivors include two sons, Leonard of Groton and Glen of Bremer-ton, Wash.; three granddaughters; and three great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by both wives, three children, three brothers and one sister.
