Funeral services for Robert C. Cook, 57, of La Habra, Calif., were held Thursday, July 5, at 2 p.m., at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Fullerton, Calif., with the Rev. Kenneth E. Hartzheim officiating.

Robert Charles Cook was born September 30, 1921, to Milo and Hatti Cook in Groton where he grew up and attended school. Upon graduating in 1939, he entered the Army, was a veteran of W.W. II and later attended Dunwoody Institute in Min-

neapolis, Minn. He married Mildred Schmidt June 14, 1947 here and they made their first home in Rapid City, later moving to La Habra, Calif. Mr. Cook was employed by the Marvin D. Shafer Co., for the past 23 years. He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Fullerton, and of the La Habra Elks Lodge BPOE No. 2095.
