Pioneer Claremont Farmer Dies Unexpectedly Sunday

Alexander F. Daly, 66, pioneer Brown county farmer, died unexpectedly Sunday at his farm home two miles north of Claremont.

He was attending to his cattle when stricken Sunday afternoon. Mrs. Daly found him a short distance from the house. She had expected him to return to dinner and when he hadn't returned by 2:00 p. m., she went to look for him.

Funeral services were held at 10:00 a m., Wednesday, at the Catholic church at Columbia with the Rev. Fr. Mardian of Hecla officiating. Burial was in Columbia cemetery. Rosary was said Tuesday evening in the Paetznick Funeral Home at Groton.

Mr. Daly was born November 4, 1885, at Columbia. He married Ruth Dinter in September of 1919. He was a well-known farmer in the county and was secretary of the Brown County Pioneer Association.

Survivors are his wife; two daughters, Mrs. James Hurin and Mrs. Wayne Cutler of Claremont; three brothers, Francis of Minneapolis, Richard and Joseph of Columbia; five sisters, Mrs. Art. Calahan of Westport, Mrs. Leo Calahan of Aberdeen, Mrs. T. B. Cosgrove of Vancouver, Canada, Mrs. Clem Wolfe of Windlock, Wash., and Mrs. Richard Irby of Juneau, Alaska.
