## MRS. CHAS. GABERT PASSES TO REWARD

FUNERAL HELD WEDNESDAY  
AT CATHOLIC CHURCH—BUR-  
IAL IN GROTON

After a lingering illness of several months, Mrs. Amelia Gabert, wife of Charles Gabert, of this city, passed to her final reward Sunday morning at 11:30 o'clock.

Amelia Ott was born at Nelson, Wis., May 23, 1863. On July 14, 1882, she became the bride of Charles Gabert and shortly following their marriage they came to South Dakota and proved up on land near Stratford, arriving there July 20, of the same year. They lived on their homestead for a number of years and after accumulating sufficient requirements retired from active life, moving to Groton. Mrs. Gabert made her home here until the time of her death, sometimes going to California for the winter. She was 63 years old at the time of her death.

Mrs. Gabert leaves to mourn her loss, her husband, and one daughter, Miss Mary, besides one brother and three sisters. The brother is William Ott, of Nelson, Wis., and the sisters are Mrs. Caroline Brougham, of Brantwood, Wis.; Miss Ida Ott, of Nelson, Wis., and Mrs. Eva Woods, of Aberdeen.

The funeral was held from the Catholic church at 10 o'clock Wednesday morning, and the remains were laid to rest in the cemetery of that faith. Rev. Fr. Esterguard, pastor of St. John's church, conducted the ceremonies.

Mrs. Gabert was a lovable character, a helpful neighbor and enduring friend. She numbered her friends by the hundreds and her sad passing is mourned by young and old alike.
