CHARLES H. GARLICK ✓

Dies at Family Home in Groton on Monday After Long Illness.

Following an illness extending over a period of four years, Charles H. Garlick responded to the final summons on Monday of this week, funeral services being held from the family home yesterday with interment in Groton Union Cemetery. Although ill for the past four years with little hope of recovery, Mr. Garlick was cheerful throughout it all, bearing up with patience which was unusual.

Charles Horace Garlick was born in Mt. Clemens, Mich., June 22, 1862. He moved to Wisconsin with his parents when ten years of age. He was united in marriage to Adele Rork, Oct. 13, 1886, at Eau Claire, Wis. Three children were born to them, Gertrude, of Minneapolis; Mildred of Aberdeen and Harold Ward, who is a member of the marines and in service in Cuba at this time.

The family moved to Groton from Morris, Minn., in 1908 at which time Mr. Garlick took a position with the Groton Milling company as a miller.

Mr. Garlick had, prior to coming to Groton, been prominent in business affairs in the community in which he lived, having owned a large mill at Morris, which was destroyed by fire.

He has a host of friends in Groton who join with us in an expression of sympathy to the bereaved relatives left to mourn his loss.
