MRS. J. T. HATTON

Mrs. Isabella Sofia Hatton, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George D. Roberts, was born at Newbury, Vermont, January 14, 1848, and died August 4, 1920. She moved with her parents to Fox Lake, Wis., at the age of three. At the age of twelve her mother died and she went back to Vermont to live with her grandmother. She returned to Fox Lake, Wis., before the close of the Civil war.

She was married to John Thomas Hatton July 8, 1867, and in 1870 they moved to St. Ansgar, Iowa. They were among the pioneer settlers in South Dakota, coming to Groton in 1882 and settled on a farm southwest of town. Eight children were born of which six are living. She is survived by her husband and six children as follows: Thomas C. Hatton, of Hugo, Col.; John H., of Denver, Col.; George D., of B. Yers, Col.; Mrs. Grace Fortune, of Hugo, Col.; Mrs. Anna Bandimere, of Golden, Col., and Mrs. Lela Bowles, of Claremont, S. D.

She also leaves a step-mother, Mrs. M. M. Roberts, of Fox Lake, Wis., and three half brothers, all of whom reside in Wisconsin.

For the past sixteen years Mrs. Hatton has made her home in this community, with occasional periods spent in Colorado and California visiting her children. She has been associated with the Methodist Episcopal church since her marriage and the funeral services were held from that church in this city Sunday forenoon at 10:45, Rev. C. B. Harrold conducting the services. Interment was made in the Groton Union cemetery.
