## Edward Hayenga

The funeral services for Edward J. Hayenga, 75, of Andover, were held Thursday, July 10, at 10:30 a.m., in United Methodist Church, Andover, with the Revs. Dean Trapp and Mark Butcher officiating. Burial was in Andover Cemetery with Paetznick-Garness Funeral Chapel Groton, in charge of arrangements.

He died Monday, July 7, 1986, at St. Luke's Hospital, Aberdeen.
