Services for Howard L. Henley, 75, Groton area retired farmer, were held Saturday, Jan. 10, at 2 p.m. in St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, Groton, with the Rev. Marvin McPhee officiating. A scriptural wake service was held at 7:30 p.m. Friday evening in the Paetznick-Garness Funeral Chapel. Burial was in the Groton Cemetery.
