

Groton Pioneer Dies ^{Sept 17} In Aberdeen Hospital ¹⁹²⁵

Funeral services for August Kohlhoff, aged pioneer, who passed away at an Aberdeen hospital early Sunday morning, was held on Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock from the home at 119 Sixth avenue, S. W., Aberdeen, and at 2:00 o'clock from the Zion Lutheran church. Rev. Mulsall officiated.

Interment was made at the cemetery in East Rondell township, near the former home of the deceased.

Mr. Kohlhoff was born in Greifenberg, Germany, on April 4, 1844, being at the time of his death, 81 years, five months and nine days of age. On March 6, 1868, he was united in marriage to Albertina Goetsch, the couple coming soon after to this country. They first settled in Wisconsin, where they resided for 15 years, after which they came to this state, locating on a homestead southwest of Groton in March, 1882.

In 1909 he retired from farming activities and moved to the Hub City. He was a member of the Zion Lutheran church.

The deceased leaves to mourn besides his widow, ten children and eleven grand-children. His only brother preceded him in death four years ago. The surviving children include: F. A., John F., Emma and Otto Kohlhoff of Stratford, S. D., J. E. and Frank Hohlhoff of Leola, Mrs. C. G. Buckele of Wessington, and Minnie Lydia and Laura of Aberdeen.
