Otto B. Krahn

Funeral services for Otto B. Krahn, 63, Bath farmer, who died last Wednesday, as a result of a tractor accident, were held Saturday afternoon at the Huebl Chapel in Aberdeen. The Christian Science service was read by Mrs. George Robertson.

Mrs. Gladys Huebl-Smith sang two solos with Mrs. Ernest Gundersen at the organ. Members of the Bath high school student body and teachers attended the services in a group.

Interment was in the family lot at Riverside cemetery, Aberdeen. Pall bearers were Roy Schott, Albert Lorenz and Lloyd Larson, all of Groton; Otto Traver and Bernard Melcher, of Bath and Joe Carr, of Aberdeen.

Mr. Krahn was born Nov 1, 1890, on a farm southwest of Groton. He grew to young manhood on the farm his parents homesteaded. On Sept. 22, 1913, he married Zola Hale, at Aberdeen.

The couple made their home on his farm near Groton for six years, when they moved to Mission, Tex. Two years later they returned to a farm near Webster, residing there until 1942, with the exception of four years when they moved to Colfax, Wash., and Leola.

In 1942 they purchased the present farm home at Bath, residing there since. He attended the Christian Science church.

In addition to his wife, survivors include a son, Donald, at home; two daughters, Mrs. Herbert Radke and Mrs. Hilbert Radke, both of Stratford; three sisters, Mrs. Emma Chadwick, Calgary, Alberta, Canada; Mrs. Mina Rippley, Santa Anna, Calif.; Mrs. Elwood Johnson, St. Helena, Calif.; two brothers, W. C. Krahn, Wapata, Wash., and A. E. Krahn, Sonoma, Calif., and five grandchildren.
