Jerome Mallett

Funeral services were held Thursday afternoon in the Andover Methodist church for Jerome Mallett, who had passed away Monday, Aug. 8, 1955. The Conde pastor officiated in the absence of Rev. Sander. A quartette composed of Mesdames P. W. Anderson, John Carr, C. B. Summers, and Millard Denholm sang three numbers. The pall bearers were A. P. Oxton, H. W. Raynes, H. A. Jerome Mallett was born in Minnesota and came to Dakota Territory with his parents in 1883 and settled on a farm south of Andover. Here he attended school and became a member of the Methodist church in which he was an active member for many years. In 1905, he was married to Belle Spencer of Groton. They lived on a farm near the old homestead until his health failed.

Three children were born to them, Harold of Andover; Mrs. Alfred Roettelle (Doris) of Verdon, and Mrs. Vern Voss (Alice) of Tacoma, Wash. Besides his wife and children he leaves five grand children, two sisters, Mrs. Mable Sperry of Groton, and Mrs. Reuben Quincer (Ada) of Los Angeles, Calif., and five brothers, Harry of Mankato, Minn., Walter of Portland, Ore., Leonard of Redfield, Elliott of Groton, and Floyd of Chicago. All were present for the funeral services, besides friends from Groton, Conde and Andover.
