W. T. Millman Dies After Long Illness

W. T. Millman, a highly respected citizen of this city, passed into the Great Beyond on Saturday, after an illness which kept him confined for the past several weeks.

Mr. Millman had been in failing health for some time past, but had managed to get down town and visit with his friends and look after his home affairs, but some time ago his illness became more acute and he sought his room and medical attention. Neither were availing and he answered the last call Saturday morning at 2 o'clock.

Mr. Millman was born in Elk Grove, LaFayette county, Wis., August 23, 1853, and was almost 76 years old at the time of his death. On March 27, 1879, he was married to Miss Isabelle E. Richards, and soon thereafter they established their home on a farm near the place of his birth. They later moved to Platteville, Wis., and then to Clark, S. D., where Mr. Millman was engaged in business for a number of years, making his home at Clark for 17 years. For the last nine years he has been a resident of this city, and during this time Groton learned to know him as a man upright and honorable in his transactions, going quietly about his business and making friends with everyone.

He leaves to mourn his loss, besides his devoted wife, two children, Mrs. Paul E. Krueger, of this city, and Ben Millman, a son, of Flandreau, besides four brother and one sister, all residing in Wisconsin, and five grandchildren.

The funeral was held at the house at 2:30 Sunday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Norris, of the Methodist church, and the remains were laid to rest in Groton cemetery.
